



General Instructions and Requirements

Due to the limited enrollment capacity of the Master Gardener training program, we encourage you to make a thoughtful and complete application that fully represents you. Before submitting your application, we recommend that you attend the Master Gardener Information Orientation on **Wednesday, September 7, 2022,** from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon at the War Memorial Building in Balboa Park (3325 Zoo Drive, San Diego, CA 92101). Attendance is not required to apply.

Submit your completed application along with two letters of recommendation by email to Leah Taylor, MG Program Coordinator, at applications@mgasdc.org by September 30, 2022. Please include your name in the subject line of your email. Your complete application package must include the completed application form *and* two letters of recommendation.

Alternatively, you may mail your application and letters of recommendation to: Master Gardener Association of San Diego County; c/o Leah Taylor, MG Program Coordinator, UC Cooperative Extension; 9335 Hazard Way, Suite 201; San Diego, CA 92123.

If you are currently a Master Gardener from another county or state and would like to be considered as a transfer into the San Diego Master Gardener organization, please contact Leah Taylor at the email provided above.

Notifications as to your status in the selection process will be done by email, informing you of next steps, as applicable. Acceptance and rejection letters will be sent via US post office.

Requirements to become a UCCE certified Master Gardener in San Diego County:

- Live in San Diego County
- Enjoy volunteering to teach / share with the public UCCE based research on topics of gardening, integrated pest management and horticultural practices
- Willingness to focus on community outreach to educate the public
- Value the concept of 'Life-Long Learning'

If accepted into the MG program:

- Must be fingerprinted and agree to a background check before beginning the program
- Have a valid driver's license and proof of current auto insurance
- Complete and sign a Code of Conduct / Responsibilities and Rights Form
- Complete and sign a Self-Disclosure Form
- Attend weekly, Tuesday classes, running January 10 June 20, 2023
- Attend planned field trips, requiring extended days on those class days
- Pass all exams with a 70% or better score
- Perform 50 hours of volunteer service within the first year of certification
- After the first year, 25 volunteer hours *and* 12 continuing education hours are required for recertification to remain an active MG
- Some travel within the county may be necessary
